**City Convention.** Time and location set: 10:00 a.m. May 13, 2006; Minneapolis South High School  
**Pre-convention committees.** Established for the 2006 City Convention:

- (a) **Arrangements.** The Arrangements Committee—
  - (1) prepares and publishes the Convention’s program, which includes the proposed agenda, proposed rules, any proposed constitutional amendment, and any other business for the Convention’s consideration;
  - (2) awards concessions for food and drink during the Convention;
  - (3) in consultation with the host site, makes rules for signs and other campaigning and otherwise regulates the use of space at the site;
  - (4) arranges tables, a hospitality area, or other space for campaigning outside the hall;
  - (5) arranges seating in the hall; and
  - (6) takes all other necessary or prudent measures for the delegates’ comfort and convenience.

The Arrangements Committee may charge a price that earns at least a reasonable return for advertising in the program, or for renting a table or other space in or near the hall.
- (b) **Credentials.** The Credentials Committee prepares a roster of delegates and alternates entitled to be seated, and accordingly prepares credentials and issues them to delegates and alternates who appear so entitled.
- (c) **Nominating.** The Nominating Committee nominates, and may if necessary recruit, at least one nominee for each Party officer that the Convention will elect. The Nominating Committee will not consider any endorsement that the Convention will consider.
- (d) **Rules.** The Rules Committee recommends rules and an agenda for the orderly conduct of the Convention’s business.
